Previous Business:

- MHS Gym - An equipment room window was created in the upper southeast area of the gym and will house equipment for the electronic scoreboards. Medina TV will also have access to the area for game broadcasting.
- The Student Council electronic TV board is now located in the gym hallway to broadcast sporting events and advertisements. MHS information slideshows will also run throughout the school day.
- MHS Fire Alarm System - Lightning had struck Medina High School back in August 2023, causing damage to the fire alarm panel. Johnson Controls repaired the damages and panel. The invoice was submitted to Insurance to cover the damages.
- Ella Canavan Playground - The soft surface rubber compound was repaired by the vendor. The playground is equipped with all inclusive equipment for all students to enjoy and fully funded by Ella Canavan PTO.
- Eliza Northrop Playground - New inclusive equipment enhancements were completed and also fully funded by Eliza Northrop PTO.
- Ella Canavan had carpet squares installed to replace worn areas of carpet that would eventually pose safety hazards. The carpet squares will come as a savings as a smaller area can be replaced quickly instead of an entire section of carpet. The squares are equipped with vinyl backing for longevity and protection against moisture.
- Two Cub Cadet 60 inch mowers, in good condition, were purchased from an auction site resulting in significant savings to the District. One mower will be housed at A.I. Root Middle School and the other at the Maintenance Department for District use.

New Business:

- Claggett Middle School Walkway - A covered walkway is being discussed that would lead from the building doors to the modular trailer doors.
- MHS Track - Discussions continue in regards to resurfacing the high school track in the most cost effective manner. Lanes are worn and a non-porous material is being considered that would protect from water and moisture resulting in an extension of longevity. Typical surfaces last approximately ten years.
- Heritage Elementary - The lower level and upper level will be renovated to comply with Preschool State requirements. Architects have been on site and drawings are nearly complete to be sent out for contractor bidding.
