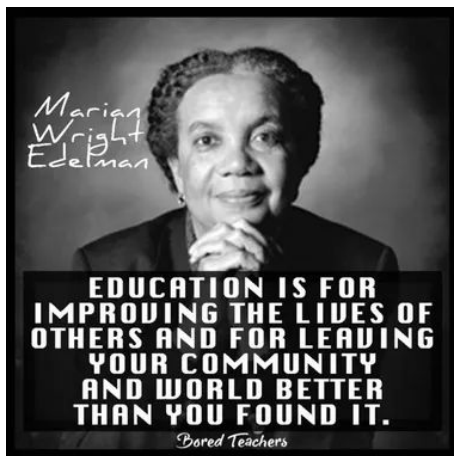

Registration Gateway - Back-to-School Update Portal

The Medina City School District requires all parents/guardians to confirm your contact information and sign off on all of the necessary paperwork each school year. This includes all students enrolled at the high school and Career Center, and in CCP, MODA, Tech School and Night School. To complete your student's update, please [click on this link](#). Student Handbook - Important Student Sign Off Required

Your student(s) have received several emails regarding this requirement that read as follows: Please [click on this link](#) for a link to the handbook as well as a google doc to sign off that you agree to the policies outlined in this year's handbook. All students are expected to sign off electronically. Parents sign off on the handbook when they complete the Registration Gateway update electronically as well. 2021 Medina Senior Scholarship Application - February 1 - February 24, 2021

The Senior Scholarship Application is now available on the MHS website under Our School, School Counselors, then under Scholarships/Opportunities. There are more than 50 scholarships from various Medina Community and Medina High School organizations, from the Medina City Schools Foundation and from the elementary and middle school Parent Teacher Organizations. The Senior Scholarship Applications is divided up into eight sections. All students must fill out the Basic Information application. Each section has similar/like category application requirements, ie played sports, pursuing a medical career. Students can complete the application sections that apply to them. Each section of the application must be completed in one sitting; it cannot be saved. The application window is February 1 through February 24, 2021. All supplemental information must be received in the White Guidance office by the end of the school day February 25, 2021, unless otherwise stated. There is a preview/criteria sheet on the website available now for students to prepare application responses.

Spring Scheduling Process

February 8 - March 26th

All students will meet individually with a school counselor to review your Spring Registration request. At this time, students will be able to adjust courses with the input of their school counselor. Grad Plan sheets for all students will be updated during this meeting.



One-on-one students meetings will occur through student study hall periods.

Students entering their senior year may request an early release. Early release will be given dependent on course availability. Courses will be scheduled as the priority over early release requests. Students entering grade 12 could have a maximum of periods 11 and 12 as an early release. Students entering grade 11 will be allowed one period of early release if their schedule produces a 12th period study hall. Only ONE PERIOD OF EARLY RELEASE will be allowed for junior students. To-be-junior students will not request the period of release, if a study hall is to occur 12th period, release will be assigned. 8th to 9th and 9th to 10th graders will be scheduled for classes from 7:30am-2:22pm. There is no early dismissal for freshmen or sophomores.

RECAPING:

Senior Students:

- Must schedule a minimum of 5 classes each semester.
- May request early release when scheduling.
- Maximum of two (2) periods of release may be given depending on course availability. Courses take priority.

Junior Students:

- Must schedule a minimum of 6 classes each semester.
- Early release will be given if study hall occurs during 12th period.
- No more than ONE PERIOD OF EARLY RELEASE will be allowed.

Sophomore/Freshmen Students:

- Must schedule a minimum of 6 classes each semester.
- Students will remain in the building the entire school day, 7:30am-2:22pm.

CCP Students of any grade level:

- If all courses are attended within Medina High School, student will follow credit and course number rules listed above.
- If student participates in CCP courses outside of Medina High School (full time or part time), the student will be required to register for 2.5 high school credits per semester.

April 9

– End of Spring Registration. Student initiated schedule changes will not be accepted after April 9, 2021. Student schedules will be developed according to Spring Registration Requests.

Medina High School Drama Club News

The Medina High School Drama Club has been busy even under current circumstances. They just completed two months rehearsing for and then recording *She Kills Monsters Virtual Realms*, a fully online version of the popular high school play, *She Kills Monsters*, an adventurous tale set against the backdrop of *Dungeons & Dragons* about friendship, loss, and acceptance. The show was shown free of cost online on January 29-31. To top off all of their work, the Club is participating in The Playhouse Square Dazzle Awards Program. About 30 high schools in Northeast Ohio participate every year. This year it is a scaled-down and virtual version, but in a typical year, each school's musical is adjudicated and judges select nominees in a variety of categories. This is followed by an awards show at Playhouse Square where selected students get to perform. The winner of best actor/actress moves on to New York City to participate in the National High School Musical Theater Awards (The Jimmy's), which this year is also virtual, to compete against winners from other states.

Through Dazzles, Medina students have also had the opportunity to participate in a series of Master Class workshops in acting, dancing, and voice with Broadway performers. These are typically done at Playhouse Square but are being done virtually this year.

2021-2021 HUDDLE Application

The HUDDLE leadership program requires using highly qualified, well-established teen role models who have taken part in a very selective application process. Students MUST be nicotine, alcohol and drug-free, be involved in school and/or community activities, have average or above average grades, be comfortable talking in front of groups, and have an interest in mentoring and supporting younger students.

Acting as role models and presenting classroom lessons designed to build resilience by increasing self-esteem and confidence, the HUDDLE leaders strive to present mental wellness for the elementary school students. Programs are delivered to 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students in Medina City Schools 7 Elementary Schools and St Francis Catholic school.

Must be tobacco, alcohol and other drug free

Must have a 3.0 GPA or better

Currently a Sophomore or Junior

School Fees

In addition to school and fall athletic fees for the 2020-2021 school year all Winter Sports and Activity Fees have been applied to your student's account and are available for viewing on www.PayForIt.net or in your student's ProgressBook account.

To view and/or pay fees in PayForIt.net you will need to create an account in PayForIt and register your student. Please follow the instructions on the PayForIt website. After adding your student, a detail of the fees due will appear on the home page. Please note that PayForIt charges a 3% credit card fee to use this service for payment. Alternatively, check or cash is accepted in the High School main office.

To view fees in your student's ProgressBook account, please go to <http://pa.neonet.org/> and click on the Medina City Schools link. Click on "Students Sign in with Google". Please note that at this time parents/guardians cannot create their own account. A parent or guardian must log in through their student. The login credentials are the student's medinabees email address and password. There is a tab for Fees on the left side of the home page. Fees cannot be paid through ProgressBook.

Class of 2021 - Transcripts and Parchment

All MHS final transcripts are sent through Parchment. Every college needs your final transcript before you start school in the fall. Send it while it is free! In April/May 2021, seniors will need to order your final transcript - you MUST select HOLD FOR GRADES! HOLD FOR GRADES will signal that your transcript needs to be held until ALL grades are posted and a graduation date added. Final Transcripts are usually sent out to colleges around the second week in June. Seniors - please email Mrs. Veverka veverkac@medinabees.org in Gold Guidance with any questions. All students should complete Parchment even if they are not attending college in the fall.

How to Check MCS Student Grades

How do parents check grades?

Parents can check grades through the Parent Portal in BlackBoard. Blackboard can be found on medinabees.org and clicking on Blackboard in the top green banner. Once signed, the Parent Portal should be on the right hand side of the screen. All of the student's classes and grades should appear there. If they have not yet set up a parent portal account, here are directions on how to do so. Please call 330-636-4350 with any Parent Portal questions.

How do students check grades?

Students are able to check grades through ProgressBook. They can access ProgressBook on their Chromebook by going to the Medina Quick Links tab and clicking on "Grades in ProgressBook". They will then need to select Medina City Schools, then choose "Students Sign-in with Google." Once signed in, students can click on grades in the left hand column. Access to all students' classes and grades will then be available on the main screen.

College Credit Plus

Ohio's College Credit Plus (CCP) can help students earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking college courses from community colleges or universities. The purpose of this program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wide variety of options to college-ready students. As a Medina High School student, taking a college course from a public college or university is free. That means no cost for tuition, books or fees. If students choose to attend a private college or university, students may have limited costs.

Medina City Schools currently has agreements with The University of Akron, Kent State University, Cuyahoga Community College and Lorain Community College for specific courses; however, students can choose to take College Credit Plus courses from any college that offers a course that would benefit his or her future. 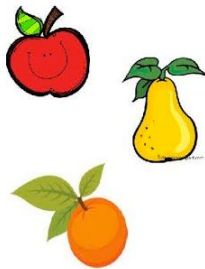

Athletics and Performing Arts Tickets

Athletic events have begun in the District as OHSAA and The Ohio Department of Health and Ohio Governor's office have approved them to move forward. Unfortunately at this time, due to the restrictions because of COVID-19 and the orders in place, we are not able to have any students at the games, staff passes, or senior passes. The only participants allowed at the games will be those that have tickets that were provided to by the players and/or coaches. A monthly pass is \$10.99 and a yearly pass is \$69.99. A portion of every subscription will be shared with the Athletic Department as well. At this time all events in the Performing Arts Center have been postponed for safety reasons.

Planning a Move?

If you currently reside in the Medina City School District and have recently moved, or plan to move to a new address within the District, you will need to provide proof of residency to the Medina City School District Registration Office. One of the following documents will be accepted as proof of residency: current utility bill, mortgage contract, purchase contract, lease agreement, insurance statement on the dwelling, or a letter from your builder indicating a possession date within 90 days of enrollment in the district. If you are moving out of the district during the school year, please notify the guidance secretaries so that the withdrawal process can begin. Please be certain to promptly register in your new school district and complete a records request so that we may release educational records to the new school.

Did you know?

Mail being sent home to parents is usually addressed "To the Parent of:" and the student's name. Sometimes that mail is returned to us by the post office because the child's last name is different from the parent's last name, and the post office says that is undeliverable as addressed. This is especially true if you live in an apartment. By the time all of this happens, several weeks can have passed. If this applies to you, please make sure to notify the post office of all last names that mail may be addressed to for delivery. Your help is appreciated.

Parent/Guardian COVID-19 Symptom Check

Medina City Schools expects all parents/guardians to conduct this assessment on a daily basis with their children.

- Parents/Guardians should assess their child(ren) each day before sending them to school
- Temperatures should be taken each morning and parents should record them at home
- Students with a fever of 100 Fahrenheit or above or a cluster of the symptoms listed below that cannot be explained by any other condition **should not be sent to school:**
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Sore throat
- Symptom checks will not be done daily with students, but students may be checked during the school day if exhibiting symptoms listed above
- If you have been exposed to anyone you suspect has COVID or if you or anyone in your home are being tested for COVID you cannot attend school

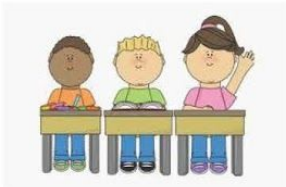
Effective Communication
