Approval of September Meeting Minutes

Secretary's Update-Julie Warfe

- Dine to Donate-Marcos Dine to Donate is tonight (10/13) and Chipotle is 10/25
- Julie will reach out to Culver's and BW3's
- Book Fair is Monday, November 7th-Thursday, November 10th. More information will be coming home.

Principal Report-Matt Mattie

- Mr. Mattie thanked everyone for all of the help they have provided this year.
- Portrait of A Bee-has been incorporated into classroom discussions and is encouraging deeper learning.
 On Friday during the teacher workday, teachers will design an outdoor learning space.
- Safety Drills-Students will practice a fire drill 1x/month, a tornado drill in the spring, and have practiced an
 active intruder drill. Safety procedures that are in place include: every door is locked (including the
 cafeteria).
- PBIS-the school continues to implement this statewide initiative where students are recognized for all of the good they are doing. Students can earn PBIS coins that they turn in for rewards.
- Leader of the Month is now called the Buckeye Award in honor of Mr. Waite. Each student receives a buckeye and learns about Mr. Waite.
- Field Trips-trying to have three per grade level. First grade has gone to Ramseyer Farms. Second Grade went to the McKinnley Museum. Fourth Grade will be going to the theatre.
- Car Line-the car line procedures are being revised and updated secondary to safety concerns being raised.
- HUDDLE is up and running.

- Halloween Parade: The Halloween Parade will be 10/28. Parents are invited to watch the parade outside starting at 1:45. Classroom parties will follow the parade.
- COVID Update: there have not been many student cases. If a student tests positive, they are to be out of school for five days (day 0=day of the positive test). No requirements for a negative test.
- Building Volunteers: Volunteers will need to be background checked every five years.

Special Guest-Officer Pinkas

- Office Pinkas reviewed school safety procedures, including lockdown procedures, fast fire drills, and ALICE drills.
- Dare has started for the fifth graders. They will talk about responsibility, peer pressure, communication, bullying, and who to go to with concerns.

President's Report-Lauren Rismiller

- Veteran's Day: On November 11th, we will host sweets with a solider. More information to be sent home. Veteran's do not need to be background checked to attend.
- We were able to purchase a Keurig Machine for the teacher lounge on Amazon Prime Days.
 We are trying to set up a STEM Day with Carnegie Science Museum.
- Teacher Grants: We were able to fund all teacher grants that were turned in. Grants included: materials for a calming corner, fidget toys, flexible seating, decodable readers, 30 basketballs for the 3rd grade music program, books for an anxiety club, baby chicks for Mrs. Shriver, and chair covers for Mrs. Nervo.
