

As we head into 2021 we continue our Online 3.0 schedule until the end of the semester, January 14th being the last day for students and January 15 being the last day for staff. As you have read from the email sent by Mr. Sable, we will then move into the Green/Gold Hybrid schedule January 19-January 29 and full student return beginning February 1.

January 19-January 29

In addition to moving to the Green/Gold hybrid schedule and a full student return, we will be providing live streaming of classes whenever possible to students who are not in attendance. Below I have included parent expectations for streaming. Teachers will let you know at the beginning of every week which dates students will need to live stream. In addition, we will provide streaming of courses for students who are home ill whenever possible. These students should also check with their teachers at the beginning of every week, if they are not too ill to log in, to determine when streaming is available for them.

What Students and Parents Streaming in Can Expect

While we want to provide the very best instruction to all of our students, we understand that managing a face to face and virtual environment can present some challenges. Teachers should do their best to include online students in class discussions, small group discussions, etc. Students at home should understand that this may not always be possible. If students have a question for their teacher that does not get answered promptly, students can always check with their teacher the next day when they are back face to face. Quarantined students can email their teacher or ask for a virtual meeting at a different time.

Teachers will let students know at the beginning of each week what times they should log in for streaming. It is the expectation that students log in during those times. Attendance will be taken.

Videotaping Classes

Parents and students have entered a new world of learning during this pandemic. As we begin livestreaming courses, students are utilizing computers to connect with their teachers and classmates and learning from their homes and other locations outside of the school building. In light of this, we wanted to share some important information with parents and students on how to ensure digital safety in this new environment.

Board Policy 5136, Personal Communication Devices, indicates that "Students are expressly prohibited from using covert means to listen-in or make a recording (audio or video) of any meeting or activity at school". During this time of online learning, students should seek permission from their teacher if they are planning to record a meeting. To protect student privacy, parents should also not take pictures or record meetings at any time. Parents should not post pictures of their child(ren)'s google meets or google classrooms to social media as this is

also a violation of student privacy. This policy has been in place and is not different than students recording live classes without prior permission from the student's teacher. We appreciate our partnership with parents and students during this pandemic and realize that as we all adjust to the new learning model, we will continue to work together to provide the best learning environment for our students.

February 1

Beginning February 1, we are excited to announce that all students will return to the building. <u>Here</u> is a link to the Medina High School calendar for the remainder of this year and <u>here</u> is a link to the new bell schedule for the remainder of the year. We will also have this schedule posted on our website.

We will also continue to offer students the opportunity to leave the building as we did first semester. <u>Here</u> is the form to sign if your student meets the criteria to leave and return to the building (2 free periods in a row which could include lunch). Late arrivals will continue to enter in the North Entrance and be checked in by staff.

We will also send out a video of school safety procedures to all parents and students by the end of this week.

The beginning of 2021 is a start of hope, hope for a vaccine and moving towards some of the things we were unable to do during these times. As we move closer to this, we also continue to experience the impact of almost a year of living with this pandemic including changes to schedules, and separation from friends and family.

<u>This</u> article from the New York Times is an excellent resource to help us all deal with quarantine. Some of the recommendations include "learning to love your faux pas". This lesson can pertain to life outside of the pandemic as well.

As Henry Ford once said, "One who fears failure limits his activities. Failure is only the opportunity to more intelligently begin again". As we end this semester, please let your students know that we are here to support them in their growth and don't expect perfection. To this end, check-in with your students about their performance this quarter and let us know if there is something we can do to assist them in completing the quarter strong. Below are also some resources I sent prior to break to assist your students in a variety of ways.

Academic Support from the Tutoring Center

Peer tutoring will once again be available this school year through the Joyce B. Ebner Tutoring Center (located at Medina High School) for all high school students. This program is made possible thanks to the continued support of the Medina City Schools Foundation. As in the past, tutoring will be available in all subject matters. In addition, preparation for the ACT and SAT is also available.

Students will be paired with National Honor Society students and other honors students. They will meet one to two times per week depending on their schedules. In addition, optional virtual tutoring will be available.

What To Do When There is a Technology Issue

Finally, below is an excellent document to keep and reference when there are technology outages at your home or in the District. The District is likely aware of the issue so there is no need to directly contact the building, teacher, or school. Please allow 15 minutes for the matter to resolve and attempt to log in again. If the matter has not been resolved in 15 minutes, your student will be excused from that session. Please look for a message from the District via
	text or call if it appears the issue is going to be longstanding.
Your technology at home is not working.	When you are able, contact your teachers and/or the building and let them know you are having issues with your technology.

Class of 2021 - Senior Diploma Verification/Commencement Participation

All MHS and MCCC seniors, with their medinabees login and password, are required to fill out the Diploma Verification/Commencement Information on-line google form. The information requested is first, middle, last name and student ID, in addition to indicating if they intend or do not intend to participate in a graduation ceremony in May. All MHS final transcripts are sent through Parchment. Every college needs your final transcript before you start school in the fall. Send it while it is free! In April/May 2021, seniors will need to order your final transcript - you MUST select HOLD FOR GRADES! HOLD FOR GRADES will signal that your transcript needs to be held until ALL grades are posted and a graduation date added. All students should complete Parchment even if they are not attending college in the fall.

MHS Debate Team News



As of Wednesday, 12/16, the MHS Debate Team has competed in eight debate tournaments virtually, which has been a truly unique experience for both the students and their coach. This approach does lack some of the excitement of in person participation, but it has provided some notable opportunities. Without any travel considerations, teams around the country have had the flexibility to participate in tournaments beyond their typical reach, which has improved the level and variety of competition.

So far, the team has done quite well, with several first and second place finishes in tournaments with as many as forty schools competing. MHS

Debate has also enjoyed its standing as one of the largest debate programs in the country. While many programs are seeing a reduction in participation, Medina has maintained the roughly 40 student membership that it has enjoyed for many years.

We have approximately ten tournaments left in our season and look forward to the possibility of an 18th consecutive "trip" to the state finals and perhaps a 12th "trip" to the national championship. That will all be determined in the qualifying tournaments in the spring, but it's looking good so far!

2021 Medina Senior Scholarship Application - February 1 - February 24, 2021

The Senior Scholarship Application will be available on the MHS website under Our School, School Counselors, then under Scholarships/Opportunities beginning February 1, 2021. There are more than 50 scholarships from various Medina Community and Medina High School organizations, from the Medina City Schools Foundation and from the elementary and middle school Parent Teacher Organizations. The Senior Scholarship Applications is divided up into eight sections. All students must fill out the Basic Information application. Each section has similar/like category application requirements, ie played sports, pursuing a medical career. Students can complete the application sections that apply to them. Each section of the application must be completed in one sitting; it cannot be saved. The application window is February 1 through February 24, 2021. All supplemental information must be received in the White Guidance office by the end of the school day February 25, 2021, unless otherwise stated. There is a preview/criteria sheet on the website available now for students to prepare application responses.

How do parents check grades?

Parents can check grades through the Parent Portal in BlackBoard. Blackboard can be found on medinabees.org and clicking on Blackboard in the top green banner. Once signed, the Parent Portal should be on the right hand side of the screen. All of the student's classes and grades should appear there. If they have not yet set up a parent portal account, here are directions on how to do so. Please call 330-636-4350 with any Parent Portal questions.

How do students check grades?

Students are able to check grades through ProgressBook. They can access ProgressBook on their Chromebook by going to the Medina Quick Links tab and clicking on "Grades in ProgressBook". They will then need to select Medina City Schools, then choose "Students Sign-in with Google." Once signed in, students can click on grades in the left hand column. Access to all students' classes and grades will then be available on the main screen.

College Credit Plus

Ohio's College Credit Plus (CCP) can help students earn college and high school credits at the same time by taking college courses from community colleges or universities. The purpose of this program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and to provide a wide variety of options to college-ready students. As a Medina High School student, taking a college course from a public college or university is free. That means no cost for tuition, books or fees. If students choose to attend a private college or university, students may have limited costs.

Medina City Schools currently has agreements with The University of Akron, Kent State University, Cuyahoga Community College and Lorain Community College for specific courses; however, students can choose to take College Credit Plus courses from any college that offers a course that would benefit his or her future. This could include online courses. To learn more about College Credit Plus, please visit the <u>College Credit Plus webpage</u> at Ohio Higher Education.

Spring Scheduling Process

Timeline for students in grades 9-11:

January 28 thru Feb 5

Spring Registration begins at Medina High School through a registration account (dasl) specifically generated for each

individual student in order to complete course requests for the next school year. Scheduling account usernames and passwords will be distributed prior to scheduling through the students' medinabees email. Distribution will include detailed instructions along with screen shots of the registration process.

Quick reference guide - link available Jan 28

Copy of course selection sheet - link available Jan 28

Students are to review the general information and registration procedures posted in the Registration Guide which will be available on the School Counselor website beginning January 22nd. First, review the required courses for your upcoming grade level which will appear for current freshmen and sophomores as selected courses on your scheduling account. These courses have been selected by your current teachers and counselors and placed on your schedule for you. Junior to be Senior students may have some courses selected for them but in most cases will need to refer to their Grad Plan sheet which is created and shared by their school counselor in their google drive. Grad Plan sheets for all juniors have been updated to indicate remaining required credits. Grad Plan sheets are also available to freshmen and sophomore students but have not been updated since last scheduling time. All sheets will be updated again during the student one-on-one meeting. Next, determine the elective courses you may be interested in taking by referring to the description of courses for details. Again, check the prerequisites. Students entering grades 10 and 11 must schedule 6 courses each semester. Students entering grade 12 must schedule 5 courses each semester. For CCP students attending courses outside the Medina High School building (full or part time) are required to schedule 2.5 high school credits per semester. Remember to consider eligibility requirements for athletic purposes (five $\frac{1}{2}$ credit courses per semester).

Discuss individually your selections for the upcoming year with your current teachers and your parents. All students will have a one-on-one meeting with their school counselor AFTER courses have been selected.

Request your course selections through the provided scheduling account. Assistance will be available at school to access your account. The media center will be open to students on Wednesday, Feb 3, Thursday, Feb 4, and Friday, Feb 5 from 7:30am-2:45pm. Students must bring their chromebooks when seeking help. (This format was updated as of Jan 13).

All requests must be entered prior to midnight February 5, 2021 to make for the most efficient meeting with your school counselor.

Scheduling 12

February 8 - March 26th

All students will meet individually with a school counselor to review your Spring Registration request. At this time, students will be able to adjust courses with the input of their school counselor. Grad Plan sheets for all students will be updated during this meeting.

One-on-one students meetings will occur through student study hall periods. The schedule of days counselors will be in present in study halls will be posted closer to the Feb 8 date.

Students entering their senior year may request an early release. Early release will be given dependent on course availability. Courses will be scheduled as the priority over early release requests. Students entering grade 12 could have a maximum of periods 11 and 12 as an early release. Students entering grade 11 will be allowed one period of early release if their schedule produces a 12th period study hall. Only ONE PERIOD OF EARLY RELEASE will be allowed for junior students. To-be-junior students will not request the period of release, if a study hall is to occur 12th period, release will be assigned. 8th to 9th and 9th to 10th graders will be scheduled for classes from 7:30am-2:22pm. There is no early dismissal for freshmen or sophomores.

RECAPPING:

Senior Students:

Must schedule a minimum of 5 classes each semester.

May request early release when scheduling.

Maximum of two (2) periods of release may be given depending on course availability. Courses take priority.

Junior Students:

Must schedule a minimum of 6 classes each semester.

Early release will be given if study hall occurs during 12th period.

No more than ONE PERIOD OF EARLY RELEASE will be allowed.

Sophomore/Freshmen Students:

Must schedule a minimum of 6 classes each semester.

Students will remain in the building the entire school day, 7:30am-2:22pm.

CCP Students of any grade level:

If all courses are attended within Medina High School, student will follow credit and course number rules listed above.

If student participates in CCP courses outside of Medina High School (full time or part time), the student will be required to register for 2.5 high school credits per semester.

April 9

End of Spring Registration. Student initiated schedule changes will not be accepted after April 9, 2021. Student schedules will be developed according to Spring Registration Requests.

School Fees

School and fall athletic fees for the 2020-2021 school year have been applied to your student's account and are available for viewing on <u>www.PayForlt.net</u> or in your student's ProgressBook account.

To view and/or pay fees in PayForlt.net you will need to create an account in PayForlt and register your student. Please follow the instructions on the PayForlt website. After adding your student, a detail of the fees due will appear on the home page. Please note that PayForlt charges a 3% credit card fee to use this service for payment. Alternatively, check or cash is accepted in the High School main office.

To view fees in your student's ProgressBook account, please go to <u>http://pa.neonet.org/</u> and click on the Medina City Schools link. Click on "Students Sign in with Google". Please note that at this time parents/guardians cannot create their own account. A parent or guardian must log in through their student. The login credentials are the student's medinabees email address and password. There is a tab for Fees on the left side of the home page. Fees cannot be paid through ProgressBook.

Athletics and Performing Arts Tickets

Athletic events have begun in the District as OHSAA and The Ohio Department of Health and Ohio Governor's office have approved them to move forward. Unfortunately at this time, due to the restrictions because of COVID-19 and the orders in place, we are not able to have any students at the games, staff passes, or senior passes. The only participants allowed at the games will be those that have tickets that were provided to by the players and/or coaches. The good news is families can watch many events from home with a subscription to the NFHS Network. Click here for more information and what events can be watched. A monthly pass is \$10.99 and a yearly pass is \$69.99. A portion of every subscription will be shared with the Athletic Department as well. At this time all events in the Performing Arts Center have been postponed for safety reasons.

Planning a Move?

If you currently reside in the Medina City School District and have recently moved, or plan to move to a new address within the District, you will need to provide proof of residency to the Medina City School District Registration Office. One of the following documents will be accepted as proof of residency: current utility bill, mortgage contract, purchase contract, lease agreement, insurance statement on the dwelling, or a letter from your builder indicating a possession date within 90 days of enrollment in the district. If you are moving out of the district during the school year, please notify the guidance secretaries so that the withdrawal process can begin. Please be certain to promptly register in your new school district and complete a records request so that we may release educational records to the new school.

Did you know?

Mail being sent home to parents is usually addressed "To the Parent of:" and the student's name. Sometimes that mail is returned to us by the post office because the child's last name is different from the parent's last name, and the post office says that is undeliverable as addressed. This is especially true if you live in an apartment. By the time all of this happens, several weeks can have passed. If this applies to you, please make sure to notify the post office of all last names that mail may be addressed to for delivery. Your help is appreciated.

Medina City Schools expects all parents/guardians to conduct this assessment on a daily basis with their children.

- Parents/Guardians should assess their child(ren) each day before sending them to school
- Temperatures should be taken each morning and parents should record them at home
- Students with a fever of 100 Fahrenheit or above or a cluster of the symptoms listed below that cannot be explained by any other condition <u>should not be</u> <u>sent to school:</u>
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste of smell
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Sore throat
- Symptom checks will not be done daily with students, but students may be checked during the school day if exhibiting symptoms listed above
- If you have been exposed to anyone you suspect has COVID or if you or anyone in your home are being tested for COVID you cannot attend school
