Welcome to the 2025 - 2026 School Year!

We are thrilled to welcome back our returning families and look forward to supporting those who are new to our Medina High School community.

At Medina High School, we are committed to creating meaningful and engaging experiences that empower our students to succeed. We strive to help students develop essential life skills such as self-advocacy, empathy, and critical and creative thinking. This type of growth requires active participation, and with your partnership, we can help our students reach their full potential.

We recognize that high school is a time of discovery, challenge, and growth—and that students today often face significant social stress and pressure. These distractions can make it difficult to remain fully engaged in the learning process. That's why we emphasize the importance of being present—both mentally and physically—in the classroom and throughout the school day.

To help maintain a focused and supportive learning environment, we want to remind families of our **cell phone and personal device policy**. During class time, students are expected to place their cell phones and other non-school issued electronic devices (including wireless earbuds/headphones) in the designated classroom phone caddy upon entry. As a one-to-one district, every student is provided with a Chromebook for academic use, making personal devices unnecessary during instructional time.

We understand there may be times during the day when urgent communication is needed. In those instances, we encourage families to contact the main office, and we will ensure your student receives the message.

To support consistency, our policy includes the following progressive steps for non-compliance:

- 1st Offense: Warning to place the device in the caddy.
- **2nd Offense:** Device turned in to the office; student may pick it up at the end of the day. Teacher contacts parent/guardian.
- **3rd Offense:** Device turned in; administrator contacts parent to create a support plan.
- 4th Offense: Device turned in; parent contacted and an after-school detention is assigned.
- **5th Offense:** Device turned in; progressive discipline applied.

If a student is seen using a cell phone during academic time by an administrator or designee, the phone may be confiscated regardless of previous offenses.

In addition to maintaining focus, safety remains one of our top priorities. All students and staff are required to wear their **school-issued ID and lanyard** around their necks at all times while on campus. ID/lanyard checks may occur at any time without prior notice. Students not complying with this policy may receive immediate disciplinary consequences.

We appreciate your support in helping us create an environment that is both safe and conducive to learning.

Chromebooks

Freshmen

Food Service Information

MCS is excited to now offer an online free and reduced-price meal application through PaySchools Central for families that believe they may qualify. PaySchools Central has provided How-To-Guides to set up your account and to complete an online free and reduced meal application. If you choose not to use the online application you can fill out the paper-free and reduced meal application and return to the Food Service & Child Nutrition Department located at the Board of Education Office, 739 Weymouth Road. The form can also be obtained and returned (completed) to any school office. You will be notified by email of your child's status. Until notification is received, you must provide your child with breakfast/lunch or money in their student accounts.

The Ohio Budget Bill has been renewed this year, so the state will cover the cost of reduced-price breakfasts and lunches. This means if you qualify for reduced-price meals, you do not have to pay the \$0.30 for breakfast or the \$0.40 for lunch.
