- Future testing information will be forthcoming. Teachers have also been communicating with their students to prepare them for testing dates and necessary information they need to know.

We are also looking forward to prom and graduation as they are quickly approaching! Graduation will be held at Ken Dukes Stadium on May 20th at 11:00 AM. Depending on the weather, graduation may move earlier or later that same day. If the weather turns severe and we cannot hold it on Saturday, we will move it to Sunday at the same time. We will proceed with the original date and time with any mild weather.

Prom will be held on May 13th at Michaud's Catering and Event Center in Strongsville. Doors will open at 6:00 PM, dinner will start at 6:30 PM, and the dance will end at 10:30 PM. will go on sale on Tuesday, April 11th and the ticket sales will end April 13th.

Wed, April 12: 11th grade SAT and 10th grade ELA II

Testing only day. No academic instruction. SAT testing will be completed by 1:00 pm, 10th grade ELA II will be completed by 11:30, and lunch will be available after ELA testing.

Wed, April 26 & Thurs, April 27: 11th grade Government testing

Normal bell schedule with pull out to media center for students currently enrolled in Government classes.

Tues, May 2: 9th grade Algebra I and 10th grade Geometry

Testing days only. No academic instruction. Testing will be completed by 11:30 am, lunch will be available after Math testing.

Wed, May 3: Biology and American History

Testing days only. No academic instruction. 10th graders attend all day and stay for lunch on Wednesday in between testing. Lunch will be available between 10:30 and 11:10 am.

Weeks of May 1-5 and May 8 - 12: AP testing

Normal bell schedule (except May 2 and 3 where there will be no bells) with pullouts for testing. Testing occurs in the media center with counselors proctoring.

In School SAT Test

- Wednesday, April 12th, 2023
- All Junior class students
- 2200 rooms on the upper, gold side last names A-K
- 1200 rooms on the upper, green side last names L-Z
- 7:30am testing begins, no late arrival
- Parking in normal location/lot
- Grade levels 9 and 12th will not report to the school building on this day
- Grade 10 will be participating in the English Language Arts End of Course exam and will be given instructions pertaining to their test.
- Upon completion of testing at approximately 12:15 p.m. Juniors will be released with NO in-person classes for the remainder of the school day

Students will need to bring:

- Multiple No. 2 Pencils with Erasers (No pens or mechanical pencils)
- A Calculator from the SAT approved list https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/taking-the-test/calculator-policy
- A valid photo ID (Student ID, Gov't ID/Driver's License or Passport)
- Snack and drink/water bottle (will be packed away during testing)

Testing Factors:

- If you are also receiving an additional letter in this packet, your student has College Board special education accommodations
- Students are able to report scores to 4 colleges. Selections will be made the day of the test. After the testing day, score reports are \$12 per requested college
- Juniors have practice materials through their Khan Academy account
- Juniors have their practice test scores which also predict college readiness benchmarks through their College Board account
- Know the difference between test optional for admission requirements and what is needed for enrollment requirements (see back of letter)

Although many universities have chosen to become test optional for admission, most universities are NOT TEST OPTIONAL for enrollment. Meaning, your child will be evaluated for admission to a university based on criteria such as courses taken and grades received throughout high school but when enrolling into courses at the university a student will need to have some type of standardized placement testing.

The SAT is an option that can be used for enrollment and is encouraged as an option by most universities. Currently placement into credit earning, non remedial courses are Evidence-Based Reading and Writing: 480 and Math: 530. Each Junior has previously registered for a College Board account allowing them to view practice scores and predicted SAT scores. All juniors also have worked with Khan Academy and have the functions of free, individualized SAT practice.

Reasons to Complete Placement Testing Before Admission...

- Class scheduling and registration process will be delayed until testing is complete.
- Math placement through a university could include up to 5 separate placement tests rather than one SAT/ACT (this is true for the University of Akron)
- Current Reading/Writing placement testing is all or nothing. You either pass both sections or you fail both sections. SAT/ACT separates reading and writing scores.
- Students will have a better idea of where they stand as far as enrollment into classes. Remember, admission does not guarantee enrollment.
- Students wishing to take online classes can schedule sooner and before many online classes are full if they have already done placement testing. This is important for students who are wanting to enroll in CCP during their senior year.

13 Medina High School Student Council Members Attend Ohio Association of Student Councils State Conference March, 17-18, 2023 at Grove City High School.

Medina High School Student Council members Paul Ceccoli, Lexi Davis Romine, Keilani Medley, Max Dudley, Hayden Henry, Piper Jackson, Avery Henry, Adelynn Ma, Kendall Perfect, Annika Pfesiter, Heidi Sebaugh, and Emma Swanson attended the 71st Annual State Conference of the Ohio Association of Student Councils (OASC) along with 100 other student leaders and advisors from throughout the state of Ohio. Seniors Paul Ceccoli and Lexi Davis Romine and Sophomores Hayden Henry and Piper Jackson were chosen to be staff members and assisted small group workshops for leadership training. Junior Keilani Medley finished serving her year as a student executive board member. Medina High School Student Council advisors, Laura Calaiacovo and Marcie Komar attended with their students. Calaiacovo was elected to the state board as an adult member and will serve for two years.

This year's conference was hosted by Grove City School and the theme was "Let Leaders Bloom," Since 1953, students have gathered to discuss and share ideas on the development and growth of student leaders, and how student councils can make a difference in their schools and communities. The conference included keynote speaker Dr. Shaun Woodly who addressed the need for making good choices in friends and making changes in ourselves and our world as leaders. The conference continued with students meeting in small group settings to learn and practice important leadership skills.

Ms. Connie Miley, Executive Director of OASC believes that it is vital we encourage young people to use their leadership skills in advancing principles of our democracy. These are 21st century skills that these students need in order to be successful, and Student Council is a perfect vehicle to practice these skills. There was also a vote to change the structure of the Ohio Association of Student Leaders to update the format to be more conducive to receiving more grants and help from businesses and the state.

Lanyards

Lanyards with Student IDs or temporary IDs must be worn by students all day and every day. Students who accumulate five or more violations of not wearing lanyards/student ID's are subject to after school detention.

From the 2022-2023 Student Handbook:

SCHOOL IDENTIFICATION

- 1. School issued ID cards and school issued lanyards must be worn and visible at all times, during the school day.
- 2. If a student has an ID badge and/or lanyard not in compliance with rule #1, they will be sent to their appropriate office for a temporary replacement and/or to purchase a new one. Repeated violations may result in student discipline.
- 3. If a student has lost or defaced their ID card, they must get a replacement from the HUB. Cost for replacing the ID card is five dollars (\$5.00) and the cost for a new lanyard is (\$2.00), \$1.00, and may be paid by cash, check. Failure to get a replacement card and/or lanyard will result in disciplinary action.
- 4. A student ID card should not be given to another person at any time. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.
- 5. Students who have lost or forgotten their ID will be sent to the office to purchase a new one.

- 6. ID cards will be necessary for computer usage, admission to school dances and other functions, and for Media Center use. Failure to have your ID card may result in the loss of privileges.
- 7. ID cards are the property of Medina High School and may NOT be defaced in any way.

Dress Code

From the 2022-2023 Student Handbook:

DRESS CODE

- 1. Being ready for school includes preparing for the day by choosing proper attire that reflects a consideration of hygiene, safety and environment. The following statements are provided as guidelines to promote understanding of a few areas of concern. Students must wear lanyards around their neck and IDs must be attached to lanyards at all times during the school day. Exceptions occur in the classroom based on teacher discretion of student activity.
- 2. Any apparel showing suggestive or profane pictures or wording; showing alcohol, tobacco, or drug-related sayings or pictures; promoting or depicting sex, violence, or self-destructive behavior; or any item that defames the nation, state, community, or an individual will not be permitted.
- 3. Tops that can be worn must cover underclothing and your midriff. Examples of tops that may NOT be worn include tube tops, halter tops, backless shirts, tops with spaghetti straps, sheer or fishnet shirts, and cut-offs or crop tops as well as other tops which show midriff.
- 4. Dresses, skirts, pants, shorts, or clothing showing skin must be long enough or worn to cover undergarments.
- 5. Clothing with group markings or clothing associated with a non-school group or gang will not be permitted; e.g. shirts of the same color or marking.
- 6. Any spiked jewelry or chains are not permitted in school; these items will be confiscated.
- 7. Proper safe footwear must be worn at all times in the school buildings.
- 8. Sunglasses are not to be worn in the building.
- 9. Hats and hoods are not permitted in school unless approved by administration.
- 10. Any new "fads" in clothing or anything not specifically covered in the above guidelines which are considered inappropriate dress shall be dealt with at the discretion of an administrator or designee.
- 11. No undergarments will be showing (male or female) whether standing or sitting.
- 12. Any other clothing deemed inappropriate by administration can be a dress code violation.

If there are any questions as to the appropriateness of any type of clothing, the school should be contacted in advance. In the event inappropriate clothing is worn or displayed, it is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements to immediately remedy the situation. Students will be retained in the office until appropriate clothing is obtained or clothing may be provided by the school. Any student violating this policy will be subject to disciplinary action.

2022-2023 Parking Permits

All students driving to MHS must have a Parking Pass. Students may park in Lots B, C, E and F with a pass. Students *are not* to park in the lots of any of the area buildings including the rec center parking lot. 2022-2023 Parking Permits will be sold at the Hub. Click here to complete the online form. Reporting Student Absences

- If a student will be missing school, a parent needs to call the Attendance line. The parent will
 need to spell the student's last name, give his/her school ID#, and the reason that he/she is
 absent.
- If a parent does not call, the student will be marked "unexcused absent" and an automated call will be generated by 10:30 a.m. each morning.
- If a student is late because of an orthodontist, doctor, dentist, court appointment, etc., the absence will be excused if the student brings in a school excuse from the doctor, dentist, etc. to the Attendance Office.

If a Student Becomes III in School

Students should report to the clinic with a pass from his/her teacher. If the student walks or drives home, the nurse will call a parent/guardian to obtain permission for that student to leave the school. If the student is being picked up, the driver can pick up that student at the front entrance A-7 doors-in the vestibule by the main office. The nurse or school staff may escort the student out if necessary.

As has always been our policy STUDENTS SHOULD NOT BE USING THEIR CELL PHONES TO CALL PARENTS DIRECTLY TO GO HOME ILL - We will enforce that any student leaving the school ILL MUST be excused through the clinic.

Tardiness to School

Oversleeping, car trouble, power failures, traffic problems, frozen car locks are all unexcused tardies. A note or call from a parent to the Attendance Office regarding the reason is always appreciated and will be noted for your student's records. A Principal or his/her designee shall make the final determination between excused or unexcused tardy if necessary. As the student accumulates tardies to school, the following consequences may result:

4 tardies ~ One (1) ASD 8 tardies ~ (2) ASDs 12 tardies ~ 2 hour Saturday school and notification 16 tardies ~ 4 hour Saturday school and notification

Leaving Early

Parents/guardians are to send in a note requesting their student leave early for the purpose of not attending an end of the day study hall. The note must be dated and the time that the student is to leave school. These notes should be brought to the attendance office by the student in the morning. Phoning in a request daily for a student to leave early is highly discouraged. Absences to avoid being in last period study hall are unexcused.

Planned Absences

The student needs to tell his/her teachers about the absence and make arrangements to make up the work. The parent needs to call the attendance line in advance and give the dates and reason the student will be missing school, such as vacation, surgery, etc.

Appointments

Phoning in a request for a student to leave early is discouraged, although sometimes unavoidable. Writing notes in the morning is preferred. Parents need to realize that it may take time to find the student, especially if the student is in a gym class or at lunch. Dismissal slip will then be delivered to the student. The parent does not come in to sign out the student. The student will then meet the parent outside of the building at the designated time.

Vacations

Ohio law does not specifically allow vacation travel to be considered an excused absence from school. In situations that are essentially unavoidable, schools are permitted to grant excused absences in order to travel. Medina City Schools allows up to 5 excused vacation days per year.

A Request for Vacation Travel is required to be filled out and turned into the Attendance Office well in advance of the intended absence. The form can be found under Forms on the MCS website, on the MHS website, on Blackboard under the Forms tab in the MHS Student Organization and this link.

Planning a Move?

If you currently reside in the Medina City School District and have recently moved, or plan to move to a new address within the District, you will need to provide proof of residency to the Medina City School District Registration Office. One of the following documents will be accepted as proof of residency: current utility bill, mortgage contract, purchase contract, lease agreement, insurance statement on the dwelling, or a letter from your builder indicating a possession date within 90 days of enrollment in the district. If you are moving out of the district during the school year, please notify the guidance secretaries so that the withdrawal process can begin. Please be certain to promptly register in your new school district and complete a records request so that we may release educational records to the new school.

How to Check MCS Student Grades

How do parents check grades?

Parents can check grades through the Parent Portal in BlackBoard. Blackboard can be found on medinabees.org and clicking on Blackboard in the top green banner. Once signed, the Parent Portal should be on the right hand side of the screen. Click on "My eBackpack" to see a copy of the current report card. How do students check grades?

AP Testing Information for Parents

Advanced Placement exams will take place May 1st -12th. All exams will be at MHS.

Taking the Advanced Placement exams is an important part of all AP courses. Medina High School requires that all students take AP exams for the AP classes that they have taken. Scoring well on an AP exam can often earn students college credit for their high school class, saving a significant amount toward tuition.

An exam has been ordered for every student and the cost for the exam was added to his or her school fees in September. Seniors must pay their fees prior to graduation or they will not be permitted to walk. If a student does not take the AP exam then the AP weight will be removed from their transcript and they will still be charged for the exam.

FAFSA - 7 Things You Need Before You Fill Out The FAFSA FORM

If you need financial aid to help you pay for college, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. The 2022-2023 FAFSA form is available now. FAFSA should fill it out as soon as possible on the official government site, fafsa.gov.

It'll be easier to complete the FAFSA form if you gather what you need ahead of time. Below are 7 items you'll need to find before you start:

- 1. Your FSA ID
- 2. Your Social Security number
- 3. Your driver's license number
- 4. Your 2020 tax records

- 5. Records of your untaxed income
- 6. Records of your assets (money)
- 7. List of school(s) you are interested in attending


