


Dance Reminders:

As we get closer to homecoming, we wanted to share a few reminders.

- 1. Current MHS students can be in attendance and may bring one guest from another school in grades 9-12. MHS graduates up to age 20 may also go as a guest.. Career Center students and home school students whose home school is MHS are also eligible to attend.
- 2. Tickets are \$20 and are non-refundable
- 3. To purchase a ticket you must have last year's fees paid and seniors need paperwork turned in to prove meningococcal immunizations are complete per state of Ohio requirements.
- 4. Tickets will be on sale through Local Level Events on the shared MHS Student Google drive from Friday, Sept 15 through Thursday, Sept. 21 ONLY.
 - *** If you are unable to purchase a ticket through Local Level, please call the school so we can assist you.
- 5. <u>You must bring your current Student ID.</u> If you do not have a student ID, you can bring a printout of Progressbook where your name and picture can be seen or be able to pull it up on your phone.
- 6. If you do not have a student ID, or cannot print or display your progressbook on your phone, you will have to enter through a separate line where we will look you up in our system for verification so you can get into the dance.
- 7. The dance will be held in the MHS gym. You must enter from the North Entrance (D parking lot) and have your student ID and ticket pulled up on your phone (or a printed copy). Doors open at 7.



8. You must wear shoes during the whole dance so, FLAT shoes are suggested: tennis shoes, Crocs,



- 9. Absolutely no water bottles, food, gum, etc. will be allowed in the gym!
- 10. Be responsible, be respectful, be ready

Homecoming and Winter Dances

Current MHS students can be in attendance and may bring one guest from another school in grades 9-12. Former high school students up to age 20 may also go as a guest. Career Center students and home school students whose home school is MHS are also eligible to attend.

Senior Prom

Prom is a senior class event. Seniors may invite another student from MHS or another high school. Seniors may also invite former high school students, age 20 and under.

All Medina High School rules are in effect at dances. Any student or guest who violates the school dance policy will not be permitted to attend the next school-sponsored dance and is subject to discipline by school administration or Medina City Police.

- 1. Medina High School ID cards are required for admission to all dances. Guests must provide a picture ID as well.
- 2. All dance participants are subject to breathalyzers and searches. Those who choose not to participate will not be admitted to the dance. Students who are found abusing any substance are subject to school discipline and/or police involvement.
- 3. There will be no inappropriate dancing as deemed by school officials.
 - Students who participate in dancing that has been deemed inappropriate by staff will be removed from the dance immediately and will not be readmitted.
 - Dancing that is dangerous, inappropriate, or sexually suggestive violates the school's dancing rules and will result in immediate removal from the dance.
 - No warnings will be given.
- 4. Students should dress appropriately for dances and remain appropriately dressed at all times.
- 5. Ticket Sales / Eligibility
 - No tickets will be sold at the door of the dance. No exceptions!
 - No one will be admitted to the dance after 8:30 pm.
- 6. Changes in dance rules may occur during the year and will be announced.
- 7. All school fees must be paid before purchasing dance tickets.

That's why we're offering the PSATTM 8/9—the first test in the SAT® Suite of Assessments—to our9th grade students. Results from this assessment help us establish a baseline for each student as they start their high school journey. The results help us focus classroom instruction and support your child's growth. Taking the PSAT 8/9 can also help your child to:

- Know where they are and where they want to go.
- Find out what AP® courses they're ready to take.
- Explore college and career options.

This fall, the PSAT 8/9 will be administered in a new digital format that will provide an overall easier testing experience for students. Your child will take the PSAT 8/9 on **October 11, 2023** using their own school-issued device and scores will be released in mid-November. MHS Sophmores and Juniors

At Medina High School, we believe in creating as many opportunities as possible for our students to own their future. That's why we offer the PSAT/NMSQT® (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) to our students. Whether your child is thinking about attending a two- or four-year college, is going straight into the workforce, or isn't sure what they want to do after high school, the PSAT/NMSQT can help make their path clearer.

Results from the PSAT/NMSQT provide insights into your child's academic strengths, along with areas they can work on while still in high school. Taking the PSAT/NMSQT can also help your child to:

- Enter the <u>National Merit® Scholarship Program</u> if they meet program requirements specified in the PSAT/NMSQT Student Guide.
- See where they are and set a target for where they want to be.
- Practice and prepare for the SAT®.
- Find out what AP® courses they're ready to take.
- Plan and pay for college.
- Connect to their future career.

This fall the PSAT/NMSQT will be administered in a new digital format—followed by the SAT in spring 2024—that will provide an overall easier testing experience for students. If students do not have a ride home, they can remain in the building for lunch and study hall until buses arrive at the end of the day.

MHS Seniors

Covid - Frequently Asked Questions

Do kids have to stay home if someone in the family has COVID? In general kids can come to school as long as they are feeling well unless they have tested positive for COVID. If a student tests positive for COVID, they have to stay home 5 days from symptom onset (symptom onset is day 0). On Day 6, as long as the student is feeling well, and has been fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, they may return to school.

Are masks required days 6-10?

No, they are recommended and encouraged. Per the CDC, individuals should wear a well-fitting mask if they have symptoms of COVID-19, if they had a positive SARS-CoV-2 test in the past 10 days, or if they had recent exposure to someone with SARS-CoV-2 infection.

Tutoring Center

Peer tutoring is available throughout the school year through the Joyce B. Ebner Tutoring Center, located at Medina High School, for all high school students. This program is made possible thanks to the continued support of the Medina City Schools Foundation. As in the past, tutoring will be available in all subject matters. ProgressBook ParentAccess

We are pleased to announce that ProgressBook ParentAccess is now available. If you are the student's legal guardian and are noted as a Primary Contact in Final Forms you should have received a ProgressBook ParentAccess Introduction Letter which includes a Registration Key. This letter with the Registration Key would have come to your email anytime between Thursday, 9/7 and Monday, 9/11. The Registration Key is necessary to link your student(s) to your account. You should have received a letter for each student you have in the district. If you are not the Primary Contact in Final Forms but you are a legal guardian and/or you are able to be copied on correspondence pertaining to your student(s) you will need to complete the ProgressBook Registration Key Request Form. This is located at the bottom of the emailed form as well as on the website https://pa.neonet.org/

ProgressBook ParentAccess allows you to...

- -View homework, grades, attendance, and missing assignments.
- -Access teacher comments, messages, and contact information.

- -Receive email alerts for low grades and missing assignments.
- -Link multiple student accounts for quick, single sign-on.

ProgressBook StudentAccess

Students are able to check grades through ProgressBook. They can access ProgressBook on their Chromebook by going to the Medina Quick Links tab and clicking on "Grades in ProgressBook". They will then need to select Medina City Schools, then choose "Students Sign-in with Google." Once signed in, students can click on grades in the left hand column. Access to all students' classes and grades will then be available on the main screen.

Lanyards

Lanyards with Student IDs or temporary IDs must be worn by students all day and every day. Students who accumulate five or more violations of not wearing lanyards/student ID's are subject to after school detention.

From the 2023-2024 Student Handbook:

SCHOOL IDENTIFICATION

- 1. School issued ID cards and school issued lanyards must be worn and visible at all times, during the school day.
- 2. If a student has an ID badge and/or lanyard not in compliance with rule #1, they will be sent to their appropriate office for a temporary replacement and/or to purchase a new one. Repeated violations may result in student discipline.
- 3. If a student has lost or defaced their ID card, they must get a replacement from the HUB. Cost for replacing the ID card is five dollars (\$5.00) and cost for a new lanyard is (\$ 2.00), and may be paid by cash, check, or credit card, with the exception of Discover. Failure to get a replacement card and/or lanyard will result in disciplinary action.
- 4. A student ID card should not be given to another person at any time. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.
- 5. Students who have lost or forgotten their ID will be sent to the office to purchase a new one.
- 6. ID cards will be necessary for computer usage, admission to school dances and other functions, and for Media Center use. Failure to have your ID card may result in the loss of privileges.
- 7. ID cards are the property of Medina High School and may NOT be defaced in any way.

Dress Code

From the 2023-2024 Student Handbook:

Being ready for school includes preparing for the day by choosing proper attire that reflects a consideration of hygiene, safety and environment. The following statements are provided as guidelines to promote understanding of a few areas of concern:

1. Students must wear lanyards around their neck and ID's must be attached to lanyards at all times during the school day. Exceptions occur in the classroom based on teacher discretion of student activity.

- 2. Any apparel showing suggestive or profane pictures or wording; showing alcohol, tobacco, or drug-related sayings or pictures; promoting or depicting sex, violence, orself-destructive behavior; or any item that defames the nation, state, community, or an individual will not be permitted.
- 3. Tops that can be worn must cover underclothing and your midriff. Examples of tops that may NOT be worn include tube tops, halter tops, backless shirts, tops with spaghetti straps, sheer or fishnet shirts, and cut-offs or crop tops as well as other tops which show midriff.
- 4. Dresses, skirts, pants, shorts, or clothing showing skin must be long enough or worn to cover undergarments.
- 5. Clothing with group markings or clothing associated with a non-school group or gang will not be permitted; e.g. shirts of the same color or marking.
- 6. Any spiked jewelry or chains are not permitted in school; these items will be confiscated.
- 7. Proper safe footwear must be worn at all times in the school buildings.
- 8. Sunglasses are not to be worn in the building.
- 9. Hats and hoods are not permitted in school unless approved by administration.
- 10. Any new "fads" in clothing or anything not specifically covered in the above guidelines which are considered inappropriate dress shall be dealt with at the discretion of an administrator or designee.
- 11. No undergarments will be showing (male or female) whether standing or sitting.
- 12. Any other clothing deemed inappropriate by administration can be a dress code violation.

If there are any questions as to the appropriateness of any type of clothing, the school should be contacted in advance. In the event inappropriate clothing is worn or displayed, it is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements to immediately remedy the situation. Students will be retained in the office until appropriate clothing is obtained or clothing may be provided by the school. Any student violating this policy will be subject to disciplinary action.

Transcripts/Parchment

To make it easier for students to request transcripts, Medina High School has partnered with Parchment to provide secure online transcript ordering available 24/7. All sophomores, juniors and seniors who have not completed their Parchment registration received an email in August 2023. All students must complete the Parchment registration. Students - please stop by to see Mrs. Carr in the Gold Guidance office if you need any assistance completing your registration.

2023-2024 Parking Permits

All students driving to MHS must have a Parking Pass. Students may park in Lots B, C, E and F with a pass. Students *are not* to park in the lots of any of the area buildings including the rec center parking lot. 2023-2024 Parking Permits will be sold at the Hub. Click here to complete the online form. Reporting Student Absences

- If a student will be missing school, a parent needs to call the Attendance line. The parent will
 need to spell the student's last name, give his/her school ID#, and the reason that he/she is
 absent.
- If a parent does not call, the student will be marked "unexcused absent" and an automated call will be generated by 10:30 a.m. each morning.
- If a student is late because of an orthodontist, doctor, dentist, court appointment, etc., the absence will be excused if the student brings in a school excuse from the doctor, dentist, etc. to the Attendance Office.

If a Student Becomes III in School

Students should report to the clinic with a pass from his/her teacher. If the student walks or drives home, the nurse will call a parent/guardian to obtain permission for that student to leave the school. If the student is being picked up, the driver can pick up that student at the front entrance A-7 doors-in the vestibule by the main office. The nurse or school staff may escort the student out if necessary.

As has always been our policy STUDENTS SHOULD NOT BE USING THEIR CELL PHONES TO CALL PARENTS DIRECTLY TO GO HOME ILL - We will enforce that any student leaving the school ILL MUST be excused through the clinic.

Tardiness to School

Oversleeping, car trouble, power failures, traffic problems, frozen car locks are all unexcused tardies. A note or call from a parent to the Attendance Office regarding the reason is always appreciated and will be noted for your student's records. A Principal or his/her designee shall make the final determination between excused or unexcused tardy if necessary. As the student accumulates tardies to school, the following consequences may result:

4 tardies ~ One (1) ASD 8 tardies ~ (2) ASDs 12 tardies ~ 2 hour Saturday school and notification 16 tardies ~ 4 hour Saturday school and notification

Leaving Early

Parents/guardians are to send in a note requesting their student leave early for the purpose of not attending an end of the day study hall. The note must be dated and the time that the student is to leave school. These notes should be brought to the attendance office by the student in the morning. Phoning in a request daily for a student to leave early is highly discouraged. Absences to avoid being in last period study hall are unexcused.

Planned Absences

The student needs to tell his/her teachers about the absence and make arrangements to make up the work. The parent needs to call the attendance line in advance and give the dates and reason the student will be missing school, such as vacation, surgery, etc.

Appointments

Phoning in a request for a student to leave early is discouraged, although sometimes unavoidable. Writing notes in the morning is preferred. Parents need to realize that it may take time to find the student, especially if the student is in a gym class or at lunch. Dismissal slip will then be delivered to the student. The parent does not come in to sign out the student. The student will then meet the parent outside of the building at the designated time.

Vacations

Ohio law does not specifically allow vacation travel to be considered an excused absence from school. In situations that are essentially unavoidable, schools are permitted to grant excused absences in order to travel. Medina City Schools allows up to 5 excused vacation days per year.

A Request for Vacation Travel is required to be filled out and turned into the Attendance Office well in advance of the intended absence. The form can be found under Forms on the MCS website, on the MHS website, on Blackboard under the Forms tab in the MHS Student Organization and this link.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: If a student will miss more than approximately 65 hours (10 days) due to a vacation, parents/guardians are required to un-enroll their student from the Medina City Schools and re-enroll them upon return from vacation. This is done by contacting the Office of Registration at 330-636-3100. Questions concerning this procedure may be directed to Dr. Kristine Quallich, Asst. Superintendent, at 330-636-3092.

Moved or Planning a Move?

If you currently reside in the Medina City School District and have recently moved, or plan to move to a new address within the District, you will need to provide proof of residency to the Medina City School District Registration Office. One of the following documents will be accepted as proof of residency: current utility bill, mortgage contract, purchase contract, lease agreement, insurance statement on the dwelling, or a letter from your builder indicating a possession date within 90 days of enrollment in the district. If you are moving out of the district during the school year, please notify the guidance secretaries so that the withdrawal process can begin. Please be certain to promptly register in your new school district and complete a records request so that we may release educational records to the new school.

How to Sign Up:

Log On to www.payschoolscentral.com and select the "Register" option from the menu. The screens will guide you through the process to establish your account:

- 1. You will be prompted to enter your contact data, password, payment information, etc.
- 2. You will need to indicate which student(s) to attach to your account by entering their student identification numbers. Students are already loaded in the PaySchools system. If you are unsure of your student's ID number, please contact the building secretary where the student attends.

Once all the information is entered, PaySchools will email a validation code for you to confirm the registration. Once confirmed, you can begin using PaySchools. Each time you log in, school messages and the balance(s) of your student(s) on your account are displayed on the *Home Page*. Please visit the "My Account" menu option to set up preferences for your email options when your account is established.

MEALACCOUNTINFORMATION

Your student(s) will be using his/her student ID number to purchase meals throughout the duration of their time at Medina City Schools. Please assist your student in learning their number. The Food Service & Child Nutrition staff will use this number to charge your student's meal amounts to their meal account. To place money in your student's account, you may send cash or a check made payable to the Medina City Schools Food Service Department or you may sign up for PaySchools Central. There is a small processing fee for this option. This helps reduce the day-to-day handling of cash, prevents the loss of lunch money, and expedites the lunch line for all students. Food Service Deposits up to \$24.99 = \$1.65 per transaction; \$25.00-\$49.99 = \$2.00 per transaction; \$50 or more = 4.5%. Any School Fees and All Other Non-Food Service Payments = 4.5%.

How to Sign Up

Log on to www.payschoolscentral.com and select the "Sign Up" option from the menu. The screens will guide you through the process to establish your account.

You will be prompted to enter your contact data, password, payment information, etc. You will need to indicate which student(s) to attach to your account by entering their student identification numbers. Students are already loaded in the PaySchools system. If you are unsure of your student's ID number, please contact the building secretary where the student attends.

Once all the information is entered, PaySchools will email a validation code for you to confirm the registration. Once confirmed, you can begin using PaySchools. Each time you log <u>in</u>, <u>school</u> messages and the balance(s) of your student(s) on your account are displayed on the *Home Page*. Please visit the "My Account" menu option to set up preferences for your email options when your account is established.

How to Get Help

Each major function used for PaySchools has online help available under the menu option of "How Do I ..." This provides step by step instructions as well as screen examples.

Within the "Help" menu option, Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) and a Contact Us feature are available to you. These areas are addressed directly to PaySchools Help Support Staff to assist users of the system.



It'll be easier to complete the FAFSA form if you gather what you need ahead of time. Below are 7 items you'll need to find before you start:

- 4. Your 2020 tax records

- 5. Records of your untaxed income
- 6. Records of your assets (money)
- 7. List of school(s) you are interested in attending


